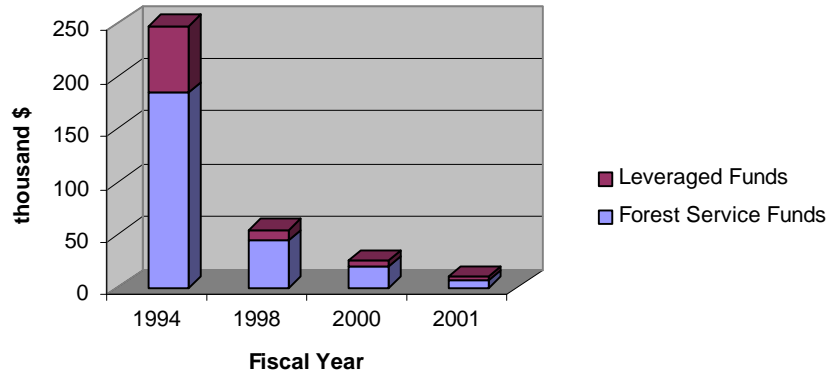




Economic Action Programs Garfield County, Washington

Garfield County, named after President James A. Garfield, is a nonmetropolitan county located in the southwestern corner of the state. Umatilla National Forest lands cover most of the county's southern area. In the nineteenth century, many of the region's major explorers passed through the county. Today, the state's least populace county bases its economy primarily on growing grain, raising livestock and processing food.
