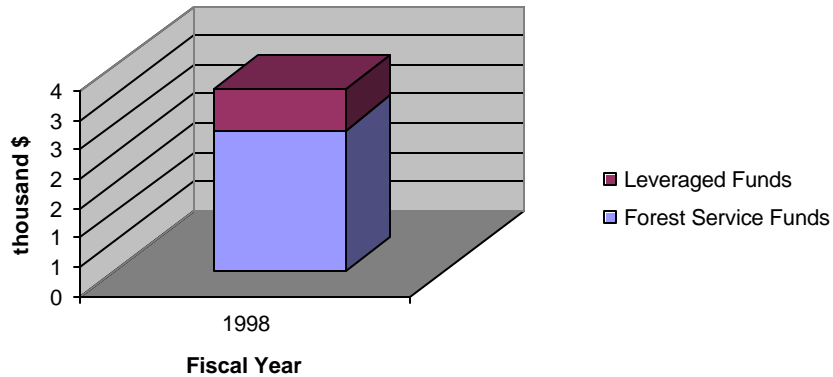
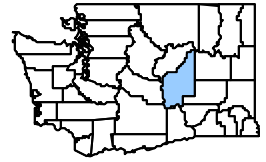




Economic Action Programs

Grant County, Washington

Grant County, named after President Ulysses S. Grant, is located in the east central part of the state and is bounded on the west by the Grand Coulee and the Columbia River. The county's populace is dispersed throughout the county in many small communities and almost half the residents live in unincorporated areas. The Columbia Basin Irrigation Project of the 1930s made a significant impact on the county, and the completion of the Grand Coulee Dam opened lands for farming and furnished electric power for industry. Today the county is a major bean and pea producer and food-processing center.
