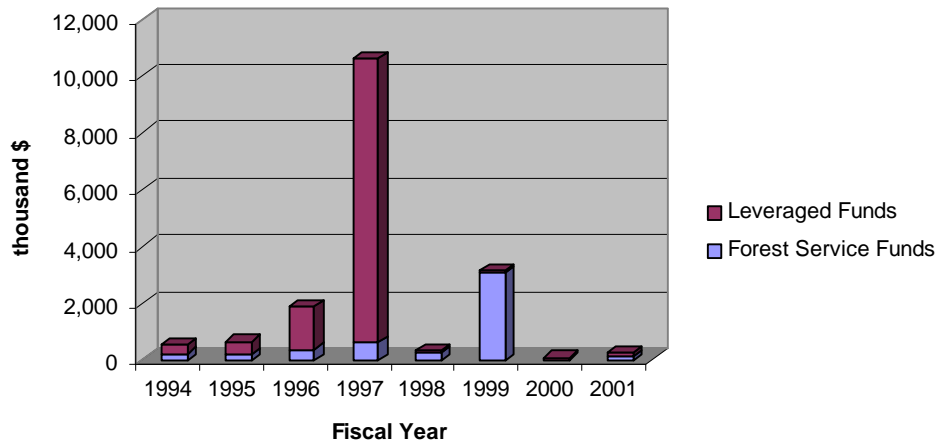




Economic Action Programs

Grays Harbor County, Washington

Grays Harbor County is a nonmetropolitan county in western Washington on the Pacific Ocean. The Quinault Indian Reservation and Olympic National Forest cover the northern part of the county. The county has a larger proportion of workers in farming, forestry, fishing, machine operator, and transportation relative to the state. Private timberlands are very significant in Grays Harbor County, making up about two-thirds of the county's land area.

One success story from Quinault Indian Nation,
Grays Harbor County, Washington



Queets Store

If you lived in Queets or were just traveling through, the nearest gas station on this isolated stretch of Highway 101 was 40 miles to the north in the town of Forks. Having an eye for opportunity, the Quinault Indian Tribe sought the assistance of the Forest Service to develop the Queets Minimarket. Forest Service funds completed the environmental analysis, site survey, engineering and architectural design. USDA Rural Development then provided construction funds to complete the project.

A 40' by 46' building has been erected on the one-acre site. Improvements include a store with self-service food, drinks, dry goods, walk-in cooler, and frozen food storage. Gas and diesel sales are also available, and a laundromat is in the planning stages. The facility, completed in late

summer of 1998, is located on the edge of the Olympic National Park and blends nicely with the natural environment. Not only does the store provide shopping opportunities for the adjacent tribal community, but if tourists run out of gas now, they won't have near the walk.

Friend's Landing

How do you turn a sow's ear into a silk purse? This project is a perfect example. The site was originally a gravel pit, donated to the Friend's Landing committee by the Friend Family in 1988. It is now a 32 acre lake, teeming with fish. Improved handicapped accessible facilities include a fishing pier on the Chehalis River, boat launch, fishing shelters, picnic shelter, parking lot, caretaker's quarters, transit shelter, interpretive trail, 18 RV sites with hook-ups, 24 tent sites, and restrooms with showers. The park is primarily the project of Trout Unlimited and Columbia Pacific RC&D. Companies and government agencies throughout the area have pitched in to assist this project as well.

The Forest Service provided funding for the construction of an interpretive trail and camp-

ground. The campground is key for producing revenue to operate and maintain the facility; by providing overnight facilities, the project will increase tourism and support local businesses.

This project has also helped protect the environment. An 800 acre adjacent parcel owned by Weyerhaeuser has been set aside by the timber giant as a nature preserve. At the dedication ceremony,
