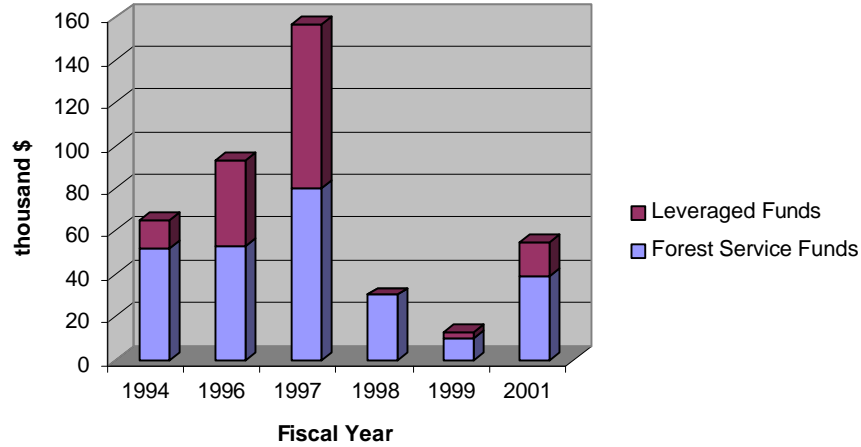
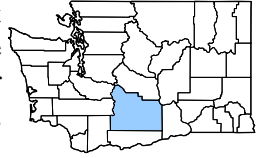




Economic Action Programs Yakima County, Washington
