John Day, OR – The Malheur National Forest will be selling four residential houses and one guard station, announced Stan Benes, Forest Supervisor. There are four houses in Prairie City, Oregon and a guard station on 2.8 acres northeast of Burns, Oregon, which will be sold through a competitive online auction.
