# **Training Announcement S-290, Intermediate Wildland Fire Behavior**

**Nominations due January 14, 2009**

**Minimum number of students: 6**

**Maximum number of students: 24+**

This is a class-room based skills course designed to prepare the prospective fireline supervisor to undertake safe and effective fire management operations. It is the second course in a series that collectively serves to develop fire behavior prediction knowledge and skills.

**Objectives:**

- Identify and describe the characteristics of fuels, weather, and topography that influence wildland fire behavior.
- Describe the interaction of fuels, weather, and topography on wildland fire behavior, fireline tactics, and safety.
- Describe the causes of extreme fire behavior conditions (long range spotting, crowning, and firewhirls) that develop due to weather, fuels, and/or topography.
- Interpret, communicate, apply, and document wildland fire behavior and weather information.

**PREREQUISITES:** Introduction to Wildland Fire Behavior (S-190).
