



Turn west (right) and travel about .3 miles, Carberry Campground is on the left side of the road.

Description: The tent sites vary in size, with the smaller, more intimate sites found adjacent to Cougar Creek. A day-use accessible picnic site is located near the parking lot. Lake access is found across County Road 777 from the campground with a trail that leads to Carberry Creek (when the lake is full pool, the trail ends at the lake).

Attractions and Considerations: Primitive boat launching facilities include a dirt/gravel parking area.

Attractions and Considerations: A gravel roadway/boat ramp follows the receding lake level, providing the only boating access when the water dips below 1,928 feet elevation.

Harr Point Campground

Rogue River National Forest-Applegate Ranger District



Attractions and Considerations: Campground is on the east shore of Applegate Lake and is accessible only by the Payette Trail or by boat. Persons accessing this site by boat may find current information about lake levels helpful. This is a semi-primitive site with no drinking water or garbage service. Please remember to pack your drinking water in and to pack your garbage out. The site remains open with reduced maintenance from November through mid-May.

Hart-tish Boat Ramp and Campground Rogue River National Forest-Applegate Ranger District



Attractions and Considerations: Hart-tish is a well developed and popular recreation site with an extensive day use area, a boat ramp and a small campground. The camping area has 5 walk-in tent sites and a parking area for self-contained RVs. Hart-Tish park is one of the few Forest Service parks with several acres of beautifully groomed lawn sloping down to the water's edge. From Hart-Tish one can look south across the lake to the peaks of the majestic Red Butte Wilderness. The boat ramp is usable until the lake drops below 1928 feet (above sea-level) or when the facility is closed for winter. For more information about Applegate Lake, including lake level information.

Nearby Hiking Opportunities: Applegate Lake trail system, including Da-ku-be-te-de Trail (#940), Grouse Loop Trail (#941), and Collings Mountain Trail (#943).

Full Service Season: **CLOSED in fall and winter.**







Attractions and Considerations: Nestled in tall timber just southwest of Mt. McLouglin is a beautiful meadow called Willow Prairie. Adjacent to the camp is a wetlands with a beaver swamp, and several large ponds where wildlife abounds. Keep your eyes open for sandhill cranes, Canada geese, ducks, elk, and deer.

The campground has ten campsites with four corrals at each site. Each site also has a picnic table and firepit. Two vault toilets are available and situated for easy access from all sites. There is also potable water from a hand-pumped well, and two troughs for your horses. Day-use parking is available across from the horsecamp.

A Campground Host is onsite between Memorial Day and Labor Day to answer any questions about the campground, the nineteen miles of maintained horse trails, or about the surrounding area in general. As volunteers, our hosts provide a great service for our visitors. If they make contact and ask you to comply with a specific regulation, they are only doing what the Forest Service has asked them to do. Please respect this, and if you have disagreement, contact the Butte Falls Ranger District.

The Willow Prairie Guard Station was constructed on the edge of the meadow in 1924 by a Forest Service road crew. Its main purpose at that time was as a firefighter guard station. The original cabin was recently restored by local volunteers and employees of the Butte Falls Ranger District. These volunteers represented the Rogue Snowmobile Club, Boy Scouts, and the Coalition of Equestrian Clubs.

The Campground has been in existence since the 1950's. In 1990, it was converted to a horsecamp with 19 miles of interconnecting trails. This renovation was through a partnership with the Forest Service and the Coalition of Equestrian Clubs which provided much of the labor for this wonderful facility.

Besides the campground rules and regulations posted on the information board,

***Please** observe the following rules and regulations to make camping at Willow Prairie Horsecamp a unique and enjoyable experience:

***Checkout** time is 2:00 PM, and the stay limit is 14 days;

***Please** display your confirmation card in the wood display box provided at your campsite, and return the existing vacant-card when leaving.

***Please** do not run, trot, or lunge horses in the meadows, roads, or trails in or near the campground. **Please minimize** the use of the campground roadway as an access route, and **please** use the designated trailway at the back of each campsite to access the main trail system.

***Please** keep horses in the stalls when not riding, and do not tie horses to picket lines or trees.

***Please** water your horses at the troughs and not at the handpump designated for human consumption.

***Please** thoroughly clean up manure, hay, and garbage from the campsite and corrals before you leave, and **please** clean up the manure from the roadway immediately. The manure and hay can be placed in the designated trailer.

***Please** do not ride within the fenced area surrounding Willow Prairie.




