9. Statement of Project Goals and Objectives: Control Noxious weeds and reduce federal lands as a seed source for noxious weeds in Coos County.
9a. Project Cost: \$9,000

10. Project Description: (Provide concise description of project and attach map.) Conduct a survey of National Forest lands in Coos County, including past weed control projects, to help identify areas where additional control of noxious weed species is required. High priority areas would include high use recreational areas, areas along highways and county roads, research natural areas and key watersheds. Implement measures to prevent the spread of weeds into new areas. Initial control actions using biological, manual or mechanical methods to control species based on "best effective tool". Priority areas for weed control (as determined through survey work) would receive NEPA planning where needed to implement Integrated weed control actions. Two weed control projects in Coos Co. (Horsfall and Spinreel areas) have completed NEPA work.
