  - Inventoried Roadless Areas (areas with wilderness potential)  
Are there specific uses or characteristics of any of the inventoried roadless areas that aren't captured in the evaluation reports that we should consider when determining how these areas should be managed? If so, what are they and how should they guide management of the area?
  
  - Off-highway Vehicle (OHV) Suitability  
Are there other criteria that should be considered when determining suitability for OHV use? If so, what are they? Why and how should they be used to identify areas suitable for OHV use?
  
  - Suitability for Timber Production  
Are there other criteria that should be considered when determining suitability for timber production? If so, what are they? Why and how should they influence areas suitable for timber production?
  
  - Suitability for Grazing  
Are there other criteria that should be considered when determining suitability for grazing? If so, what are they? Why and how should they impact grazing on national forest land?

- Suitability for Wildland Fire

Are there other criteria that should be considered when determining suitability for wildland fire? If so, what are they? Why and how should they influence where wildland fire is used?

- Species Diversity

Are there other species we should consider when selecting focal species? If so, what are they? Why and how should they be considered?

- Social and Economic Values and Information

Are there other social and economic values and information we should consider when determining suitability for recommending wilderness, off-highway vehicle use, timber production, grazing, and wildland fire? If so, what are they? Why and how should they be considered?

5. What strategies should be considered to achieve the desired conditions? How would you develop a strategy to best integrate achieving the ecological, social, and economic desired conditions? What topics or geographic areas are of the highest priority to you?
