### **Closures Modified near Trout Meadows and Ukiah Complex Fires**

**Trout Meadows Fire:** The 3,890 acre Trout Meadows Fire, burning in the North Fork John Day Wilderness nine miles northwest of Granite, Oregon, is 100% percent contained. All area, trail and road closures in the vicinity of this wildfire are now open to the public.

Crews will continue mop-up operations within the interior of the fireline and begin the rehabilitation of fire suppression activities. The public can expect to encounter fire suppression traffic when traveling on roads near the Trout Meadows Fire and are asked to drive with caution.

**Ukiah Complex Fires:** The Ukiah Complex Fires, located near the town of Ukiah, OR, have burned 4,764 acres and are 90% contained. Several road closures in the vicinity of the fires have been lifted. A few road closures remain as fire fighters mop-up hot spots and work to rehab fireline.

#### **The following Forest System Roads remain CLOSED until further notice:**

- Forest Road 54 from its junction with Forest Road 5440 south to its junction with Forest Road 5445.
- Forest Road 5400320
- Forest Road 5425, including all its spur roads
- Forest Road 5417, including all its spur roads
- Forest Road 5412030
