### **National Environmental Policy Act**

The Forest Service's environmental process is guided by the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA). On July 24, 2008, the Department of Agriculture moved the Forest Service's NEPA codifying procedures from the Forest Service Manual (FSM) and Handbook (FSH) to the Code of Federal Regulations (CFRs). They now can be found in 36 CFR part 220. Placing Forest Service NEPA procedures in the CFRs makes it consistent with other federal agencies. Existing language from the FSH was incorporated into the new regulations with little change. The same types of environmental documents (categorical exclusions (CE), environmental assessments (EA), and environmental impact statements (EIS)) are still used when analyzing projects. Determining which type of document is most suited to a particular project is still the anticipated level of environmental effects.

For example, projects with a proposed action that do not individually or cumulatively have a significant effect on the human environment nor contain any extraordinary circumstances may be categorically excluded from further analysis (the mere presence of one or more of the resource conditions that should be considered in determining whether extraordinary circumstances exists does not preclude the use of a categorical exclusion, It is the existence of a cause-effect relationship between a proposed action and the potential effect. If such a relationship exists, the degree of the potential effect of the proposed action on these resource conditions determines whether extraordinary circumstances exist). Certain projects may fall within two types of CE categories: 1) actions excluded from documentation in which a case file and decision memo are not required; or 2) actions which a case file and decision memo are required.

Examples of a project not requiring a case file and decision memo (but not limited to) are:

- ◆ closing a road during periods of extreme fire danger
- ◆ repair and maintenance of roads, trails, and landline boundaries
- ◆ repair and maintenance of recreation sites and facilities
- ◆ replacing a roof
- ◆ surveying a landline boundary.

Examples of a project requiring a case file and decision memo (but not limited to) are:

- ◆ construction and reconstruction of a trail
- ◆ girdling trees to create snags
- ◆ rebuilding a fence.

When is it determined that a project can not be categorically excluded from documentation or that there may be the possibility of significant effects, an environment assessment or environmental impact statement is written. More information regarding these types of documents can also be

## RELEASE OF NAMES AND ADDRESSES

In response to an opinion from the Office of General Council, there has been a change in how Region 6 will deal with requests for the release of names and addresses of National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) commenters. Upon request, the Forest Service will now release names and addresses on NEPA letters as well as the NEPA mailing list used to solicit and respond to comments.

## HOW TO READ THE SOPA (LEGEND)

The SOPA is presented in a tabular format to facilitate its use. Proposed Actions are grouped by the administrative unit they affect, in a descending organizational hierarchy. For each project there are eight boxes of information:

- The first column contains the Project Name and expected type of analysis.
- The second column contains the thematic Project Purpose(s) of the action.
- The third, fourth, and fifth columns contain information about the estimated and actual status of the project (Planning Status, Decision, Expected Implementation).
- The sixth, last, column contains the Project Contact information.
- Seventh and eighth are in two rows below the second through six columns. The first row is a brief project Description. The second row is Location information.

### Legend

**Project Name:** The name of the proposed action.

**Project Purpose:** The purpose(s) of the proposed action.

**Description:** A brief description of the nature of the proposed action.

**Location:** Where the activity is proposed to occur - may include Forest Service administrative unit name, state, county, legal description, and/or other physical description.

### **Planning Status:**

1. **Developing Proposal**, indicates that formal public scoping is expected to start within the SOPA period. This status is included to give people an early alert to the formulation of project proposals and near-future scoping processes.
2. **In Progress**, includes scoping or ongoing planning efforts. In Progress is initiated by public scoping of a Proposed Action. For an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS), the start of public scoping is denoted by publication of the Notice of Intent (NOI) in the Federal Register. For an Environmental Assessment (EA) and Decision Memo (DM), the start of public scoping is determined by the Line Officer (e.g., mailing, public meeting, etc.). A project remains In Progress until it is either put On Hold, Cancelled, or Completed.
3. **Completed**, indicates that all of the planned decision documents have been signed. Completed projects will be listed as such once on the schedule and then removed.
4. **On Hold**, indicates that planning for the project has been suspended and will likely be resumed at a later date. On Hold projects will remain on the schedule until Completed or Cancelled.

5. **Cancelled**, indicates that planning for the project has been terminated. Cancelled projects will be listed as such once on the schedule and then removed.

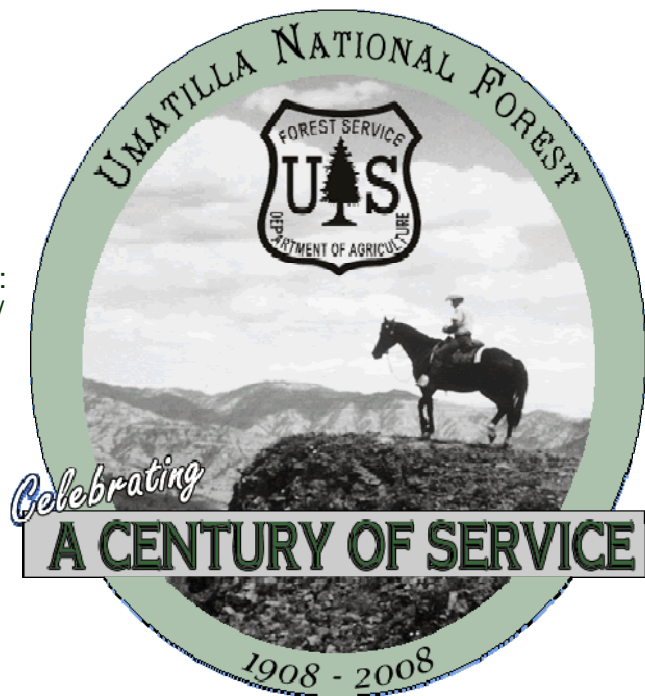
Estimated and actual planning status dates are also provided as relevant.

**Decision:** When the activity is expected to be approved or was approved by signing the decision document.

**Expected Implementation:** An estimate of when the activity might occur on the ground.
