

## Fire Lookouts on the Umatilla National Forest

### A Chronology

The table below lists all the known fire lookouts at this point in time and includes the succession of lookout structure styles over the years at each location. Information about the lookout locations and their structures is compiled from the following sources:

An asterisk (\*) after the name of the lookout indicates a panoramic photo was taken from the lookout in 1935-37.

Under "Location" the "(WA)" indicates the lookout station is in Washington (all others are in Oregon).

Information about the building/structures is more comprehensive for the lookouts that are gone. The extant lookouts are described in more detail in their inventory reports.
