# Forest Accomplishments

### *Successful Implementation of Campground, Northwest Forest Pass and Facility Rental Programs Continues*



*A new toilet facility was constructed at Whitehorse Falls Campground on the Diamond Lake Ranger District. Finish-work is in process using other funding sources.*

The Forest continues with successful implementation of the Campground, Northwest Forest Pass and Cabin/Lookout Rental projects. Following is a summary of the major accomplishments in each program area.

The R-6 Fee Demo Program has been expanded to camping on the Tiller Ranger District. There was an increased law enforcement presence in all campgrounds, with expanded coverage on holiday weekends. New accessible picnic tables were constructed and placed in recreation sites with funding from partnership with "Secure Rural School and Community Self-Determination Act of 2000".

The Visitor Information Center was operated at Diamond Lake and the evening campfire programs were continued. A sewage alarm cable was tested and repaired at Diamond Lake.

Using funds from the Northwest Forest Pass, there was an increased law enforcement presence at trailhead facilities and at Umpqua Hot Springs. In addition, the interior of the Umpqua Hot Springs toilet building was painted.

In the area of recreation lodging, vandalism was repaired at Fairview Peak Lookout and a solar light installed. The exterior of Butler Butte Lookout was painted and windows replaced.

### Northwest Forest Pass:

- Painted the interior of the Umpqua Hot Springs toilet building.

- Expanded Fee Demo with R-6 Camping to the Tiller Ranger District.
- Partnered with PAYCO funding to construct and place new picnic tables in recreation sites.
- Tested and repaired the sewage alarm cable at Diamond Lake.
- Repaired the solar panels at Broken Arrow Campground.
- Continued evening campfire interpretive programs at Diamond Lake.
- Expanded Law Enforcement coverage on holiday weekends.



### Recreation Lodging:

- Replaced windows at Pickett Butte Lookout.
- Painted the exterior of Butler Butte Lookout.
- Repaired vandalism and installed solar light at Fairview Peak Lookout and restroom.
