- Warm clothing for evening if camping. It can get might chilly at night in May.

Accommodations

Free tent and RV camping will be available on the Allingham camp grounds. There will be no RV hook ups, but water and bathrooms will be available.

Directions to Allingham Camp

Heading west out of Sisters go about 9 miles on Hwy 20 then turn right (north) on FS Road 14. Signs will say ‘to Camp Sherman’. Stay on 14 to first intersection and continue straight on Road 1419. Keep going straight to next intersection and then go straight again on Road 1420. At next intersection take a right (east) at Road 1217. Go about $\frac{3}{4}$ mile and Allingham Guard Station will be on the right just before the bridge over the Metolius River. You should see a small cabin and gravel parking lot.

Coming from the west on Hwy. 20, the turn off to Camp Sherman will be about 3.5 miles from Suttle Lake. The turnoff will be to the left onto FS Road 14 (Camp Sherman turnoff), then the same directions as above

If you get lost and end up in Camp Sherman ask the folks in the store for directions to Allingham Guard Station.

Food for the Weekend

Professionally catered meals will be served over the Weekend for Breakfast, Lunch and Dinners. Vegetarian dishes will be available. Please consider making a donation towards the cost of providing the meals (\$10/day suggested donation). Please bring your own snacks and drinks.
