WELCOME TO TWIN KNOBS RECREATION AREA

Beautiful mountains and a sparkling lake surround the 700-acre Twin Knobs Campground. There are 216 campsites that accommodate a large R.V. or family tent, providing privacy and comfort in a natural setting.

Facilities include modern bath houses with showers, three group use areas, beautiful foot trails, scenic overlooks, boat ramps, and a 2,000 foot beach. Weekly amphitheater programs, scheduled campground activities, volleyball courts, basketball goals, and horseshoe pits provide family fun and entertainment.

The large sandy beach with roped swimming area offers visitors a spectacular view of the lake.

The concrete boat ramp features a dock for easy loading and a large parking lot. Boats may be anchored close to many campsites. Boats are allowed outside of swimming area at the beach.

Twin Knobs Recreation Area is managed under a concession permit in cooperation with the Daniel Boone National Forest. Neither the federal government nor the concessionaire are responsible for any loss or damage to personal property.

If you have any questions regarding the rules of this facility please feel free to speak with the host in your loop or at the Entrance Station.

REGISTRATION, SET-UP & PARKING

- Please register and pay before you set up your site. Leave something on the site after you have registered and paid for the site so that it is obviously occupied.
- Single campsites may be used for NOT MORE THAN 6 PEOPLE and two vehicles/units. Double campsites may be used by UP TO 12 PERSONS and 4 vehicles/units. Additional vehicles will be charged \$5 per night.
- Maximum length of stay is 14 consecutive days.
- Check out time is 1:00 p.m. Those staying will be assessed a fee.
- Only registered campers are allowed in Twin Knobs after 10 p.m.
- All camping equipment must be on tent pads, within the impact area.
- Park ONLY on the pavement. Do not park on grass, along roadside, or in unoccupied areas. All vehicles and boat trailers must be parked at your own campsite, or in designated parking areas (marked with a big "P"). All campsite spurs are back-in type. Do not damage the road shoulder by trying to pull straight in. Only boats owned by registered campers are permitted.
- Refunds will not be granted when a visitor leaves because of inclement weather, has been evicted for disciplinary reasons, or for a portion of a day after 1 p.m., except in an emergency situation where the campground or part of the campground must be closed. Authorized refunds will be made by mail.
- Golden Age/Access Passports must be used only by the person to whom they are issued. Passport holder may pay for only one site at the passport rate and must occupy that site.

* No passport discounts on surcharge fees. "Passport" refers to discount card holders of the Federal Recreation Passport Program.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

The following rules are designed to ensure continued beauty in this area and to make your visit, and everyone else's, more enjoyable. Please help us to keep it clean and safe.

All visitors and users of the national forest are subject to Federal Regulations posted throughout the campground and published in Title 36 Code 0, Federal Regulations 261.

COURTESY

- Quiet hours are 10 p.m. to 6 am. Generators may not be operated during that time. Observe quiet hours by turning off radios and machinery, and by keeping your voice down.
- Public consumption of alcoholic beverages is prohibited.
- Pets must always be restrained or on a leash not longer than 6 feet, or in a cage. Do not leave pets unattended.
- The hydrants are for everyone's use. Don't leave a hose attached to the hydrant.

SAFETY

- Campfires are permitted in grills only. Make sure your fire is out before retiring at night or when leaving your campsite.
- For your safety, extension cords may not be plugged in at the rest rooms.
- Do not discharge firearms, including air rifles, BB guns, or bows and arrows, within the recreation area. Fireworks and chainsaws are also prohibited.
- State traffic laws apply to national forest areas. Observe all traffic signs, especially one way signs and posted speed limits. Watch for children at play.
- Trails and sidewalks in this recreation area are for foot travel only. For the safety of walkers, do not use bicycles, mopeds, or motorcycles on the trails, sidewalks, or walkways.
- At the beach, children under 12 must be accompanied by an adult. No lifeguard on duty.
- For after-hour emergencies contact the Campground Managers.

KEEPING OUR FACILITIES CLEAN

- Clean dishes, pots, pans, silverware and fish only at your site. The rest rooms and hydrants are not designed for the cleaning of food, fish or clothing.
- A dumping station is provided for RV's. All RV waste water must be dumped there.
- Garbage dumpsters are located in each loop. Please use them. A garbage can is provided for recycling aluminum cans.
- Pick up after your pet. (Yes, even that!). Pets are not allowed in the restrooms or on the beach.

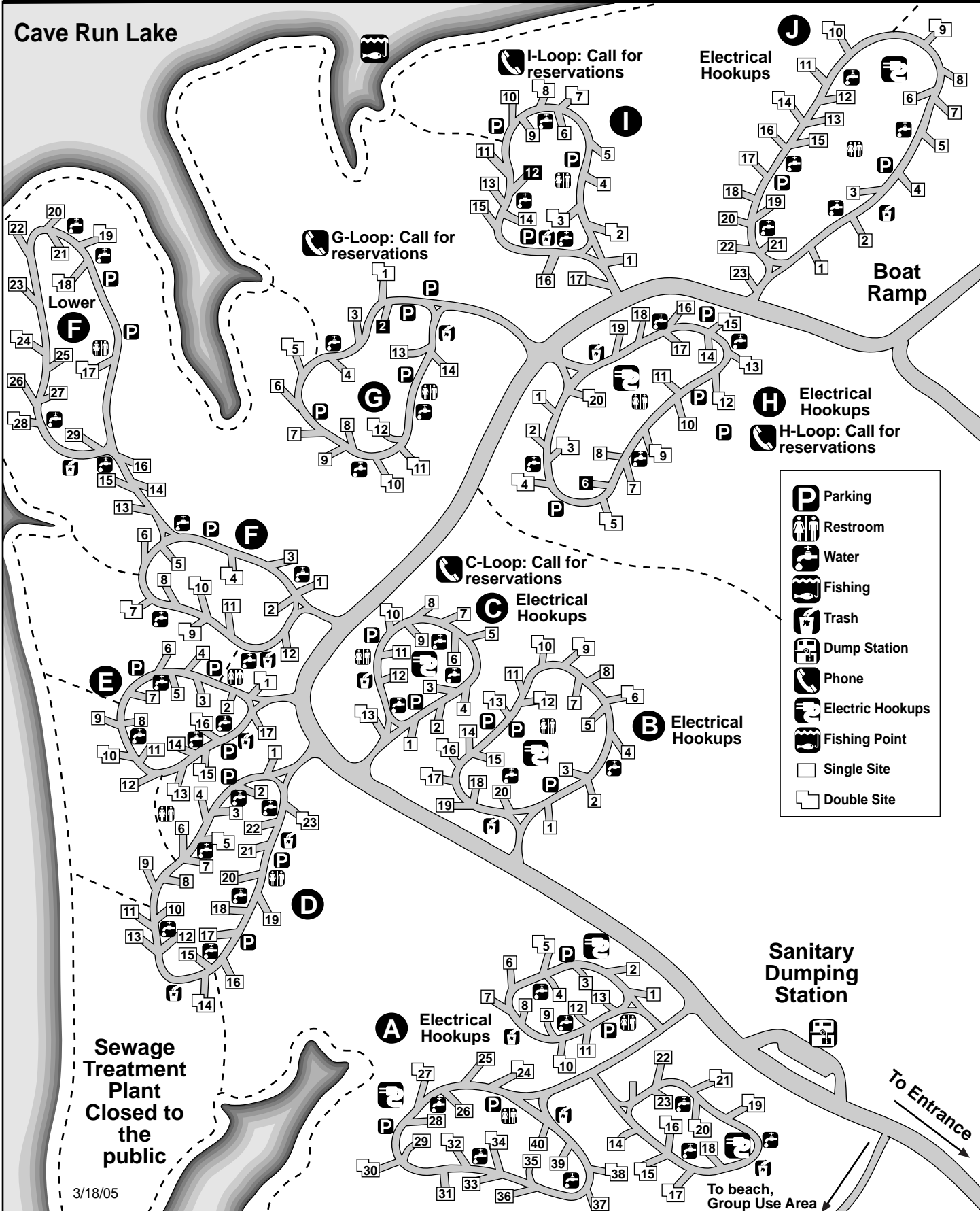
