Furys Ferry Boat Ramp is located in the southern portion of the Long Cane Ranger District of the Sumter National Forest. The site offers boating and fishing opportunities.

Attractions

Located on the Savannah River, this secluded boat ramp offers access to some of the finest fishing between Strom Thurmond Reservoir and Stevens Creek Dam. The area is managed to improve wildlife habitat. This goal, coupled with the close proximity to Stevens Creek makes the site ideal for recreational fishing and boating. A small picnic area situated among hardwoods adds to the attraction of this spot.

Surrounding Area

Nearby points of interest include Strom Thurmond Reservoir, and Lick Fork Lake Recreation Area.

Directions: From Edgefield, take SC Route 23 south for 8.2 miles. Bear left onto Route 230, drive 11.2 miles. Turn right onto Route S 19-53; drive 3.7 miles. Turn left onto Route S 19-53; drive to entrance on left.
From Modoc, take SC Route 28 south for 9.7 miles. Turn left onto Route S 33-112; drive to entrance on right.

An elevated picnic area at the Long Cane Boat Ramp offers scenic observation points. Four picnic tables and a central fire ring add to the attraction of this spot. Designated parking for trailers is provided.

From McCormick, take SC Route 28 north 5.5 miles. Turn left onto Route S 33-276; drive 1.3 miles. Bear right onto F.S. Road 3007; drive 0.7 mile to site.

From Abbeville, take SC Route 28 south 14.3 miles. Turn right onto State Route S 33-276; drive 1.3 miles. Bear right onto F.S. Road 3007; drive 0.7 mile to site.

Directions to the Highway 28 Boat

Ramp: From McCormick, take SC Route 28 north 6.6 miles, turn right at entrance sign. From Abbeville, take S.C. Route 28 south 13.2 miles, turn left at entrance sign.
