Lick Fork Lake Hiking Trail

Highlights

The trailhead is at the swimming area of Lick Fork Lake Recreation Area. Follow this easy to moderately challenging 1.9-mile loop through the picturesque woods surrounding Lick Fork Lake. A canopy of mixed hardwood and pine trees shelter fern, and a variety of wildflowers that flourish along the trail. This is a good hiking trail for girl and boy scouts.

Surrounding Area

Nearby points of interest include Edgefield (home of 10 Governors), National Wild Turkey Federation Headquarters, Horn Creek Trail, Furys Ferry Boat Ramp, Strom Thurmond Reservoir, and Hamilton Branch State Park.

Directions: From Edgefield, take SC 23 south 8.2 miles. Bear left onto SC 230. Drive 0.5 mile to route 219-263, drive 1.9 miles to entrance on right.

From Exit 1 on I-20 at North Augusta, go north on SC 230 through Colliers. Approximately 3 miles past Colliers, turn right onto Edgefield County S-263. Drive 2 miles to the entrance to Lick Fork Recreation Area on the right.

Camping: Camping facilities are available at Lick Fork Lake Recreation Area.

Difficulty level: easy to moderate

Fees: Parking is \$3.00 per car at Lick Fork Lake Recreation Area

Length: 1.9 mile loop

Safety: During temperate months, be prepared for biting insects and high temperatures. The trail can be slippery and a bit challenging as you make your way across rocks to ford a stream.

Season: year-round

Surface type: dirt
