### Whetstone Horse Camp

### Highlights

Offering 28 miles of nearby horse trails, Whetstone Horse Camp is a great getaway for horseback riders who like to ride and camp. It serves as a base camp for riders on both the Rocky Gap (South Carolina) and the Willis Knob (Georgia) Horse Trails.

The camp, located about 13 miles northwest of Walhalla, has 20 sites with parking spurs for horse trailers: 10 are first come, first served, (sites 1 through 7, and 18, 19, and 20) while 10 must be reserved (sites 8 through 17). ### Surrounding Area

Across the river on the Georgia side is another camp that is part of this trail system – Willis Knob Horse Camp. Campers must obtain reservations. Call the Tallulah District office at 706-782-3320 for more information.

**Directions:** From Walhalla, go north 6 miles on State Highway 28. Turn left onto Whetstone Road. Go straight for about 5 miles. At the four-way stop go straight for about 1.5 miles. Pavement ends and a gravel road begins. A sign for Whetstone Horse Camp is about 3/4 mile down the gravel road.

**Fees:** \$12/day per site. A reservation fee of \$9 will be added per site. Horse trail and day-use parking have no fee.

**Season:** year-round—busiest times are summer and fall.

**Site amenities:**


- Centrally-located drinking water
- Cooking grills, hitching rails, tables and lantern posts
- Wheelchair accessible toilets

**Reservations:** 10 sites are available only by reservation. Reservations may be made by calling ReserveUSA at 877-444-6777 or online at [www.ReserveUSA.com](http://www.ReserveUSA.com). A reservation fee of \$9 will be added per site.

**Restrictions:** Organized or advertised rides require a special use permit and route approval by the District Ranger.

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## Regulations

Regulations are necessary to make sure your stay on the Sumter is fun and safe. They also ensure a quality experience with the least damage to natural resources. Please help by obeying these rules.

- Horses must be kept away from camp sites.
- Stay limit is 14 days.
- Blocking, restricting, or otherwise interfering with the use of a road, gate, or trail is prohibited. Not only is it dangerous, but also may hinder administrative functions or emergency access.
- All pets must be on a leash in the camping area.
- Do not tie horses to trees. Do not ride, tether, or hobble a horse, saddle or pack animal in violation of posted notices.
- Camping is prohibited in the day use parking area.
- Build fires only in designated fire rings, using downed wood.
- Use lantern poles provided.
- Within the Chattooga River Corridor in South Carolina, horseback riding is restricted to Rocky Gap Trail.

Fees are \$12/day/site. A reservation fee of \$9 will be added per site. Fees must be paid within 30 minutes of occupying a site.

This camp has 20 sites. 10 sites are available only by reservation. Reservations may be made by calling 877-444-6777 or online at [www.ReserveUSA.com](http://www.ReserveUSA.com). A reservation fee of \$9 will be added per site.

One camper or two tents are permitted per camping unit. Up to two vehicles will be permitted at each site. Other vehicles must be parked in the parking area.

# Horse Sense



## Safety

- File a trip plan with family or friends so someone will know where you are and whom to contact should you fail to return as planned.
- Take a first-aid kit, snake bite kit, compass and map. Know the location of the nearest hospital.
- Watch for hazards along the trail. Do not try to jump trees and other obstacles.
- Stay on trails to avoid stump holes in the woods.
- Take a break from time to time to rest.
- Wear blaze orange during the big-game hunting season (October through December).
- Have at least two adults in your party.
- Watch for vehicles when crossing roads.
- Locked vehicles are not completely safe. Leave valuable and unnecessary equipment at home.
