Little Pond Trail

Trail Facts:

Length: 5.0 miles round trip	Feature: Pond, Views, Glastenbury Wilderness Access
Max elevation change: 340 feet	USGS maps: Woodford Quad
Amount of use: Light-Moderate	Hiking level: Easy
Average hike time: 2 ½ – 3 ½ hours round trip	

Trail Description:

From the trailhead follow Forest Road 275 (snowmobile trail & high clearance road) in a gradual ascent to Little Pond. After half a mile, a power line is reached with views to the east and west. At the end of FR 275, continue north on the Little Pond Hiking Trail into the Glastenbury Wilderness to Little Pond. Please practice Leave No Trace ethics, such as carry out what you carry in.

Directions:

From Route 7 in Bennington, the trailhead is 9.5 miles east on Route 9. The parking area is found on the north side of Route 9.

From Route 100 in Wilmington, the trailhead is about 12.0 miles west on Rte 9. The parking area is found on the north side of Route 9.

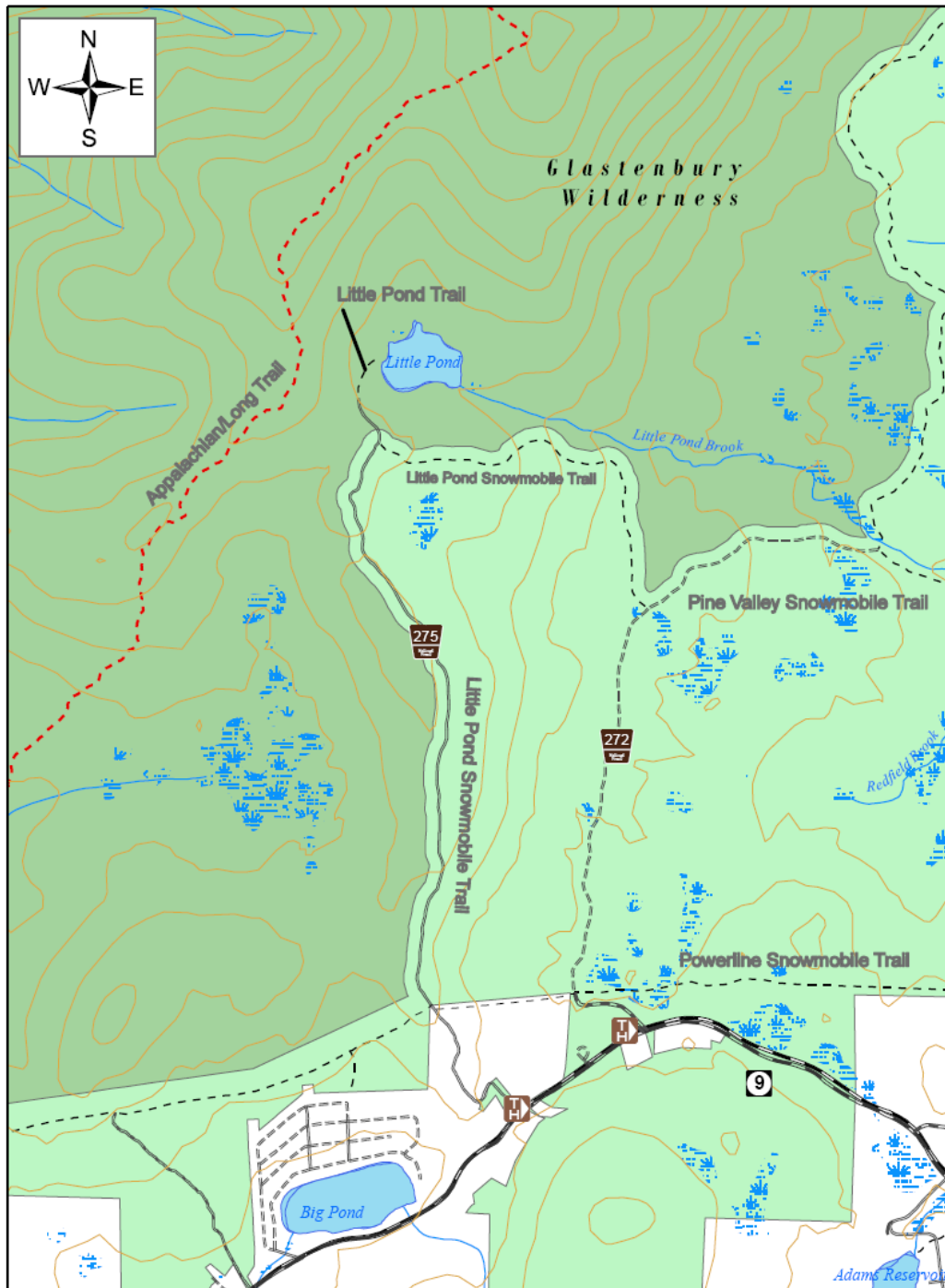
