

Cedar Creek Motorsport Trail

*It is the policy of the Huron-Manistee National Forests that all Forest lands are **closed unless posted open**. Motorized vehicles that are licensed as ORVs can operate on trails, roads, and areas which are designated and signed for their use. All National Forest roads are open to "street legal" vehicles, unless posted closed. Motorized trails are designated for vehicles less than 50" wide.*

The Cedar Creek terrain is flat to rolling with sandy soils. The trail parallels Cedar Creek for several miles and has two bridge crossings. Vegetation is mostly oak forest with grass, ferns, and shrubs in the understory. There are also red and white pine forests in the area.

The Cedar Creek Trail is located in the Northeast part of Muskegon County, Michigan, between Holton and Twin Lake. The parking area is located just south of Ryerson Road on Linderman Road. A sign on Ryerson Road marks the entrance to the parking area. A bulletin board with current trail information is located at the parking lot.

The trail system is 24 miles long, all on single-track 50" trail. Traffic is two-way on this system.


Access

From Muskegon: Take US-31 north 5 miles to Hwy M-120. Take M-120 northeast 6 miles to Twin Lake. Take Ryerson Road from Twin Lake two miles east to the parking area.

From Grand Rapids: Take Hwy M-37 north 20 miles to Hwy M-46. Take M-46 west for 13 miles to Maple Island Road (B-31). Take Maple Island Road north for 10 miles to Ryerson Road. Take Ryerson Road west for 4 miles.

Considerations

- Travel only trails designated open for the type of ORV you have. This trail is open to ATVs and motorcycles.
- Operator and vehicle must meet all applicable State and vehicle operator requirements.
- All ORVs must have, in good working condition and in constant use, a muffler which will meet or exceed all sound emission



standards set by state law. Exhaust noise shall not exceed 99Db(A) or 94Db(A) on vehicles manufactured after Jan 1, 1982 when tested according to the provisions of the SAE J1287, June 86 test. All ORVs must be equipped with a U.S. Forest Service approved spark arrester.

- A DNR Off-Road Vehicle sticker is required on this trail.
- **ORVs are not allowed on county, forest, or two-track roads unless they are street legal.**

- This trail is located entirely on single track trail on National Forest System land. The trail crosses Ryerson Road at two locations, as well as, numerous light traffic public roads, so attention to **stop** and **caution** signs is important.
- Gas and public phones are available in Holton and Twin Lake.
- You can help maintain good riding conditions on the trail by slowing your speed. This prevents "whoops" from developing.
- It is prohibited to operate a vehicle in a manner which damages or unreasonably disturbs the land, wildlife, or vegetation.
