Twinwood Lake offers a primitive camping experience for those wishing to enjoy the quiet solitude of nature. Twinwood lake is almost nearly surrounded by National Forest land. The North Country National Scenic Hiking Trail accesses this site with a spur trail. The lake offers fishing opportunities for bass and blue gill. An improved boat launch is provided.

LOCATION

Twinwood Lake is located in Newaygo County, Michigan. The nearest community is White Cloud, about 6 miles north.

ACCESS

From White Cloud: Travel south on M-37 about 5 miles, then turn left on 40th St. Travel 1/4 mile to Basswood Rd., Turn right and travel 1/3 mile to Forest Road 5448. Turn left and follow the narrow two-track road approximately 1/4 mile to the site.

From Newaygo: Travel north on M-37 about 4.5 miles, then turn right on 40th St. Travel 1/4 mile to Basswood Rd., Turn right and travel 1/3 mile to Forest Road 5448. Turn left and follow the narrow two-track road approximately 1/4 mile to the site.



SEASON

The managed season is from Memorial Day through Labor Day weekend. However, camping is allowed year-round. Please check with the Baldwin Ranger Station regarding dates outside the managed season (231-745-4631 or TTY 231-745-8297). The area is not snow-plowed in winter.

FEES

A Huron-Manistee National Forest vehicle pass is required at this site. Daily passes can be purchased



on site. Weekly and annual passes can be purchased at the Baldwin Ranger Station and at participating vendors. Please contact the Ranger Station at 231-745-4631 for complete details and additional information.

CONSIDERATIONS

Camping is limited to 14 continuous days and you must occupy the site every day.

To avoid resource damage, camping is allowed at designated sites only.

Visitors are asked to please pack out what you pack in.



Please collect only dead and down firewood for campfires. It is illegal to cut live trees.

Please do not wash dishes, clothes, or clean fish in the lake. Use biodegradable soap and dispose of waste water at least 200 feet away from any water source.

Off-road vehicles are not allowed in this campground or on National Forest lands unless on a trail designated and signed for the type of ORV you are riding.
