Bear Track Campground is located on the beautiful Little Manistee River, which offers excellent fishing and canoeing opportunities. The campground is in a very natural and scenic surrounding and offers a rustic camping experience.

LOCATION

Bear Track Campground is located in Lake County, Michigan. The nearest community is Irons, about 6 1/2 miles east.

NATIONAL FOREST ACCESS CAMPGROUND

From Irons, go west on 10 1/2 Mile Road for 3 miles, then north for 1/2 mile. Go west for 2 1/2 miles on 11 Mile Road, then onto 10 1/2 Mile Road about 1/2 mile to Forest Service Road 5202. Turn right to the entrance road.


From Wellston, leave M-55 and go south on County Road 669 (Bosschem Rd) 4 miles to 12 Mile Road, then west 1/2 mile. Go south on Bass Lake Road for 1 mile to 11 Mile Road, then west 2 miles onto 10 1/2 Mile Road. Travel about 1/2 mile to Forest Service Road 5202, then right to the entrance road.

FACILITIES AVAILABLE

- 16 Graveled parking spurs
- 4 Vault toilet buildings
- 20 Fire rings
- 20 Tables
- 1 Hand pump
- 4 Group camping sites
- Canoe access

SEASON

The managed season is from April 15 through October 15. However, camping is allowed year-round, unless closed by snowfall. Please check with the Manistee Ranger Station regarding dates outside the managed season (231-723-2211 or TTY 231-723-0124).



FEES

For the latest information regarding camping fees and condition of the facility, contact the Manistee Ranger District at (231) 723-2211 or (231) 723-0124 TTY. No reservations may be made for the campsites. This campground is operated by a concessionaire. A day use fee is required, see campground bulletin board for pricing information.

CONSIDERATIONS

Camping is limited to 14 continuous days and you must occupy the site every day.

To avoid resource damage, camping is allowed at designated sites only.

Care should be taken to keep the area clean and in the condition it was found, so visitors are asked to please pack out what they pack in.
