One of the most popular campgrounds in Wexford County, Peterson Bridge offers direct canoe access to the beautiful Pine River. The Pine River is well known as one of the most outstanding canoeing and trout fishing rivers in the midwest. The Pine River is under a watercraft permit system. This campground offers both paved parking spurs and walk-in sites.

## LOCATION

Peterson Bridge Campground is located in Wexford County, Michigan. The nearest community is Wellston, about 1.5 miles north.

## NATIONAL FOREST ACCESS CAMPGROUND

From the north, follow M-37 south 1.5 miles from its junction with M-55. Turn left into the area after crossing the bridge over the Pine River.


From the south, follow M-37 north 21.5 miles from Baldwin. Turn right into the area prior to crossing the bridge over the Pine River.

## FACILITIES AVAILABLE

- 20 Paved parking spurs
- 11 Walk-in tent sites
- 4 Vault toilet buildings
- 1 Flush toilet building
- 31 Fire rings
- 31 Tables
- 3 Spigots

## SEASON

The managed season is from April 15 through October 01. However, camping is allowed year-round, unless closed by snowfall. Please check with the Manistee Ranger Station regarding dates outside the managed season (231-723-2211 or TTY 231-723-0124).



## FEES

For the latest information regarding camping fees and condition of the facility, contact the Manistee Ranger District at (231) 723-2211 or (231) 723-0124 TTY. No reservations may be made for the campsites. This campground is operated by a concessionaire. A day use fee is required, see campground bulletin board for pricing information.

## CONSIDERATIONS

Watercraft permits are required on the Pine River. These can be obtained from the Baldwin Ranger Station located at 650 North Michigan Avenue or by calling 231-745-4631. Watercraft permit reservations are available.

Care should be taken to keep the area clean and in the condition it was found, so visitors are asked to please pack out what they pack in.
