Ravine Campground is located adjacent to Poplar Creek and is a very rustic campground. The outdoor enthusiast will enjoy the peace and solitude available at this campground. The campground offers a picnic area with a small shelter for day use as well.

LOCATION

Ravine Campground is located in Wexford County, Michigan. The nearest community is Cadillac, located about 12 miles east.

NATIONAL FOREST ACCESS CAMPGROUND

From the east, turn south off M-55 9 miles west of the M-55 and M-115 junction. Follow S. 21 Mile Road 1 mile, then right for 2 miles on 46 Mile Road, then left .9 miles on S 17 Mile Road (Forest Road 5334) to the site.


From the west, turn south off M-55 at 13 Mile Road (5.4 miles west of M-55 and M-37 junction). Follow 2 miles then turn left on 48 Mile Road and follow 2 miles south to 17 Mile Road, then turn right for .9 miles to the site.

SEASON

The managed season is from April 15 through October 15. However, camping is allowed year-round, unless closed by snowfall. Please check with the Manistee Ranger Station regarding dates outside the managed season (231-723-2211 or TTY 231-723-0124).



FEES

For the latest information regarding fees and condition of the facility, contact the Manistee Ranger District at (231) 723-2211 or (231) 723-0124 TTY. No reservations may be made for the campsites. There is a \$3 day use fee.

CONSIDERATIONS

Camping is limited to 14 continuous days and you must occupy the site every day.

Care should be taken to keep the area clean and in the condition it was found, so visitors are asked to please pack out what they pack in.
