

Seaton Creek Campground adjoins Seaton Creek and is at the upper end of the backwater of Hodenpyl Dam Pond on the Big Manistee River. Surrounding waters offer excellent fishing and canoeing opportunities. The trailhead for the Manistee River Trail is within the campground. It is located in a very natural and scenic surrounding and offers a rustic camping experience.

## LOCATION

Seaton Creek Campground is located in Wexford County, Michigan. The nearest community is Mesick, about 7 miles northeast.



## NATIONAL FOREST ACCESS CAMPGROUND

From the north, follow M-37 south 6 miles from Mesick. Turn right on 26 Road (near Yuma) for 1.7 miles, then right on O'Rourke Drive for 1.3 miles, then right on Forest Road 5993 for 0.4 miles to the site.

From the south, take M-37 north 9 miles from its intersection with M-55. Turn left on 26 Road for 1.7 miles, then right on O'Rourke Drive for 1.3 miles, then right on Forest Road 5993 for 0.4 miles to the site.

## SEASON

The managed season is from Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day. However the area is open year around, unless closed by snowfall. Please check with the Manistee Ranger Station regarding dates outside the managed season (231-723-2211 or TTY 231-723-0124).

## FEES

For the latest information regarding camping fees and condition of the facility, contact the Manistee Ranger District at (231) 723-2211 or (231) 723-0124 TTY. No reservations may be made for the campsites. This campground is operated by a concessionaire. A day use fee is required, see campground bulletin board for pricing information.

## CONSIDERATIONS

Camping is limited to 14 continuous days and you must occupy the site every day.

To avoid resource damage, camping is allowed at designated sites only.

Care should be taken to keep the area clean and in the condition it was found, so visitors are asked to please pack out what they pack in.
