The Wakeley Lake Foot-Travel Area is a special area designed for the protection and restoration of threatened loons and eagles. With an extensive network of trails, visitors are able to wander and explore this scenic, non-motorized area. Vegetation varies from tag alder and conifer swamps to upland jack pine, white pine, and oak. The area provides excellent opportunities for fishing; however, due to the fish population and its importance to the loons and eagles, fishing is limited to catch and release only. Walk-in camping is welcomed and visitors are asked to please carry out what they carry in.

## LOCATION

The Wakeley Lake Area is located in Crawford County, Michigan. The nearest community is Grayling, about 10 miles west.

## ACCESS


There is one designated point of entry to the property, located off of M-72. This point is about 1 mile east of Wakeley Bridge/Chase Bridge Road. Parking is available at the entry point.

## FACILITIES AVAILABLE

The area is a non-motorized natural setting having four designated campsites, one vault toilet building, and places for hiking, skiing and fishing. A loon nesting area may also be seen at the Wakeley Lake Area from March 1 to July 15.

## SEASON

The Wakeley Lake Area is open to the public year round. The fishing season is from June 15 through August 31.



## FEES

A Huron Manistee National Forest Recreation Fee is required at this site. Please check with the Mio Ranger Station at 989-826-3252 for complete details and costs.

## CONSIDERATIONS

Some restrictions apply to the Wakeley Lake Foot-Travel Area:

1. Closed to motorized recreation use; including boat motors.
2. Catch and release fishing only from June 15 through August 31.
3. Camping outside the designated camping area must take place at least 200 feet from the lake and the trail system.
