Information Technology Specialist (GS-2210-11) (Application software developer).

Duties: This position is an application software developer (computer programmer) for the Interior West Forest Inventory and Analysis Program (IW-FIA), headquartered in Ogden, Utah. IW-FIA conducts forest land resource inventories and forest health monitoring activities throughout the Interior West States including Arizona, Colorado, Idaho, New Mexico, Nevada, Montana, Utah, and Wyoming. The incumbent will be responsible for writing a variety of programs and managing data in Oracle database systems. Duties will include writing programs to move field data from handheld data records to a national Oracle database or developing programs to store and manage prefield data. Knowledge of Oracle, Java, C#, PL/SQL, .Net, and/or other programming languages required. Skill in database architecture and design are also needed. Incumbent must have the ability to write code, document and test computer programs.

The incumbent will work with other programmers in Ogden and will also work with national teams developing systems to be used by all the FIA units across the U.S. Therefore, it is necessary to be able to work as part of a team.
