1. How many Electronic Products Environmental Assessment Tool (EPEAT) - registered computers did your agency procure in FY 2009?

9892 out of 11416 computers bought were EPEAT-registered, which is 86.7 %

2. How many agency computers currently have computer power management (CPM) enabled so that the computers go to “standby” (“sleep”) after 30 minutes of inactivity?
