***August 17, 2017 at 11:00 a.m. (EDT).** ProNR Forest Management Series Webinar: Upland Hardwood Management in the Piedmont. (Sponsored by North Carolina State University, Extension Forestry) Speaker: David K. Schnake, RF, CF (Research Operations Manager with North Carolina Department of Agriculture & Consumer Services, Research Stations Division). This webinar will acquaint the participants with the Piedmont and subsections of the region that run from southern New York State through 8 U.S. States, ending in east-central Alabama. Piedmont land-use history, soils, succession, and previous forest conditions put current management options into perspective. Present day management and prescription options for upland Piedmont forests must take into account species composition and density, soils, site, topography and more. Regeneration strategies and their potential success can be strongly influenced by tailoring a variety of site prep and regeneration methods. No pre-registration is required!
