

Family Forest Ownerships with 10+ Acres in New Hampshire, 2011-2013

The U.S. Forest Service, Forest Inventory and Analysis program conducts the National Woodland Owner Survey in order to better understand: who owns America's forests, why they own it, what they have done with it in the past, and what they intend to do with it in the future. This document summarizes data on family forest owners with 10+ acres in New Hampshire. These summaries are based on responses from randomly selected landowners from across New Hampshire collected between 2011 and 2013 (n=146). 


Figure 1.—Percentage of forest land in New Hampshire by ownership category.²




Figure 2.—Private (■) and public (■) forest land across New Hampshire. Source: <http://dx.doi.org/10.2737/RDS-2014-0002> (Hewes et al. 2014b).

Characteristics of Family Forest Ownerships with 10+ Acres in New Hampshire

- Area owned: 2,164,000 acres³ (SE=91,000)
- Number of ownerships: 39,000 (SE=4,000)




Figure 3.—Size of forest holdings.




Figure 4.—Forest land is part of home or farm.




Figure 5.—Forest land tenure.




Figure 6.—Reasons for owning.^{4,5}




Figure 9.—Activities in the *past* 5 years.⁵




Figure 7.—Landowner concerns.⁴




Figure 10.—Likely activities in the *next* 5 years.⁵




Figure 8.—Landowner age.




Figure 11.—Management activities.
