It is fully understood and agreed that this permit may be cancelled, in whole or in part, after written notice, for: (a) failure to comply with the terms and conditions of this permit, regulations of the Secretary of Agriculture on which this permit is based, or annual operating or other instructions of Authorized Officers issued pursuant to this permit; (b) knowingly and willfully making a false statement or representation in the grazing application on which this permit is based; or (c) conviction for failure to comply with Federal laws or regulations or State and local laws relating to livestock control and to protection of air, water, soil and vegetation, fish and wildlife, and other environmental values when exercising the grazing use authorized by the permit. This permit may also be cancelled because of resource conditions or permittee request. Any decision to cancel this permit, in whole or in part, may be appealed by the permittee pursuant to 36 CFR 214.

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PART 2 - GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. **Permit Requirements.** The issuance of a Bill for Collection and payment of fees shown on the Bill authorizes the number, kind, and class of livestock, period of use, and authorized area(s) for this permit.
2. **Bill for Collection.** Prior to the beginning of the grazing season, the Forest Service will send the permittee a Bill for Collection specifying the kind, number, and class of livestock allowed to graze, the period of use, the authorized area(s), and the grazing fees. This Bill, when paid, becomes part of this permit.
3. **Payment of Fees.** Livestock owned or controlled by the permittee cannot be on the National Forest System lands or other lands under Forest Service control identified in Part 1 unless the Bill for Collection has been paid.
4. **Administrative Offset and Credit Reporting.** Pursuant to 31 USC 3716 and 7 CFR Part 3, Subpart B, any monies that are payable or may become payable from the United States under this permit to the permittee may be subject to administrative offset for the collection of a delinquent debt the permittee owes to the United States. Information on the permittee's responsibility for a commercial debt or delinquent consumer debt owed the United States shall be disclosed to consumer or credit reporting agencies.
5. **Interest, Penalty, and Administrative Costs.** Pursuant to 31 USC 3717 and 7 CFR Part 3, Subpart B, interest shall be charged on any payment or fee not paid within 30 days from the date the payment or fee was due. Interest shall accrue from the date the payment was due. Interest shall be charged using the rate prescribed by the United States Department of the Treasury Fiscal Requirements Manual in effect on the date from which interest begins to accrue. In addition, in the event the account becomes delinquent, administrative costs may be assessed. A penalty of 6 percent per year shall be assessed on any payment or fee more than 90 days overdue. Payments will be credited on the date received at the designated deposit location. Due date(s) which fall on a weekend or Federal holiday shall be extended to the close of business on the next business day.
6. **Term of Permit.** This permit expires on _____ unless terminated on an earlier date as provided herein. The period of use specified herein may be extended but not beyond the date approved through issuance of a Bill for Collection and payment thereof.
7. **Range and Livestock Management.**
 - (a) Current management plan(s) for the land described in Part 1 is made a part of and incorporated into this permit, and the permittee will carry out its provisions, or annual operating or other instructions issued by the Authorized Officer.
 - (b) This permit may be cancelled, in whole or in part, by the Authorized Officer to improve resource conditions or in response to the permittee's violation of terms and conditions of this permit.
 - (c) The Authorized Officer may require the permittee to defer placing permitted livestock on the land described in Part 1 of the permit at the beginning of the period of use if the forage is not ready to be grazed. The Authorized Officer may also require the permittee to remove permitted livestock from the lands described in Part 1 of the permit before the expiration of the period of use if the available forage has been consumed, standards are not being met, or to prevent damage to National Forest System lands and resources, and/or other lands under Forest Service control.

(d) The permittee will allow only the numbers, kind, and class of livestock on the authorized area during the period of use specified in Part 1 or the Bill for Collection, including any adjustments made pursuant to Section 7(c) above. If the permittee's livestock are grazing in greater numbers, or at times or places other than authorized by this permit, the permittee shall be billed for excess use at the unauthorized use rate and the authorized officer may cancel this permit.

(e) The permittee's livestock may not be on National Forest System land or other land under Forest Service control except as authorized by this permit or the Bill for Collection.

(f) The Authorized Officer may require the permittee to place or fasten appropriate marks or tags on the livestock that will identify them as permitted to graze under this permit. The Authorized Officer may require the permittee to gather permitted livestock to enable an accurate count to be made.

(g) Only livestock marked, tagged, or branded as shown in the application upon which this permit is based or as required under Section 7(f) will be allowed to graze under this permit.

(h) The permittee will pay the costs of, perform, or otherwise provide for the proportionate share of cooperative range improvements and management practices (which may include identified monitoring related to the livestock grazing use authorized by this permit) on the land described in Part 1 of this permit when determined by the Authorized Officer that such improvements and practices are necessary for the protection and management of the National Forest System lands and resources.

(i) The permittee is responsible for the maintenance of all assigned range improvements to standards of repair, orderliness, and safety acceptable to the Authorized Officer and/or as specified in Part 3 of this permit.

8. **Protection.** The permittee will protect the land described in Part 1 of this permit from fire or other damage. The permittee will pay the United States for damage to National Forest System lands and resources, including range improvements, caused by the permittee's negligence or by the permittee's violation of the terms and conditions of this permit or applicable law or regulation.

9. **General.**

(a) Permanent structural range improvements on the lands described in Part 1 of this permit are the property of the United States Government unless specifically designated otherwise. Structural range improvements, which are the property of the United States, may not be removed by the permittee nor may the permittee be compensated for them upon expiration or cancellation of this permit.

(b) The permittee may not sell, transfer, assign, lease, sublet, or otherwise convey this permit in whole or in part.

(c) The issuance of this permit gives the permittee no priority for renewal or issuance of additional temporary grazing or livestock use permits.

(d) The term "permittee" in this permit includes any agents, employees, contractors, or subcontractors who have been hired by the permittee to perform duties associated with and required by this permit.
