

# **Respect the River Campsite Inventory**

## ***Database Site Numbering Protocol***

*July 15, 2002*

All of the numbers on the Campsite Inventory form--Site Description, placed together become the site number in the database, which is the number that links all of the tables together. The road number (7 digits) followed by the road mileage number (to tenth of mile. 3 total digits), followed by cardinal direction of the beginning of the site access road from the FS road (NESW), followed by the site number (allowing for more than one dispersed site located along the same spur road (2 digits). If the last 2 digits of the number are 00, that is the site number for a road that accesses several sites. The only fields that would be filled out in the database for that number would be the road length and width.

Example: Site # 430030013.1N02 is on Road 4300-300 at M.P. 13.1 located on the north side of the road, site number 2. If the last 2 numbers were N00, it would indicate that the information is about the road accessing site 1 and 2 (and perhaps others) only.
