

Invasive plant treatments and native plant seeding techniques on recently burned grasslands designated as critical wildlife winter range.

2006 Accomplishments

Research funded through the Native Revegetation program in 2005 and 2006 evaluated invasive plant treatments and native plant seeding techniques on recently burned grasslands designated as critical wildlife winter range. In 2005 sampling found the soil seed bank of exotic-plant dominated grasslands to be native seed limited. Seed germination and plant establishment was significant in 2006. A detailed report is pending after completion of additional sampling in 2007.
